Our 3 classroom Maaori bilingual and bi-literate teaching unit shared by 3 teachers serves up to 50 students. We are excited to open up our Samoan Immersion Unit starting with our Juniors Years 0 - 1 delivering instructional teaching in Gagana Samoa the Samoan Language at Level 1 81 - 100%. Our aspirations and goals for our tamariki are to achieve their fullest potential. Through high expectations, care, aroha, guardianship of our unique environment, taonga and self-determination we strive for the best in all we do.


